• WELCOME

In order to manage game animals, the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation is offering hunters the opportunity to apply for controlled hunt permits. Controlled hunts are held in situations where unrestricted hunting would pose safety concerns or where overharvest might occur.

Controlled hunt permits are awarded through random drawing, and some of the hunts are highly sought after, with more applicants than available permits. If selected, hunters will be able to hunt on lands managed by the Department and cooperating state, federal and private areas.

We wish you good luck and good hunting.

No Hunter Ed? Try an apprentice-designated license.

Oklahoma's license laws have changed. Many hunting licenses and permits can now be sold with an apprentice designation that allows individuals ages 10 to 35 without hunter education certification to hunt under certain conditions. • WHO CAN APPLY?

Residents: You must possess one of the following licenses, or be exempt from one of these licenses, to apply for controlled hunts. You must purchase the license prior to applying for controlled hunts. (Purchase a license by going to

<https://www.wildlifedepartment.com/forget1/OnlineSales.aspx>.) Read the following descriptions to determine which best applies to you.

*Note: If you have an apprentice-designated license, you may still apply. However, some hunts require hunter education certification by the date of the hunt. Be sure to read all information listed with each hunt selection.

1. Resident Annual Hunting or Combination License OR Resident 5-Year Hunting or Combination License – Prior to applying for controlled hunts, all residents age 18 and older must possess a valid Oklahoma hunting license for the current calendar year of the drawing.
2. Resident Youth Hunting or Combination – Prior to applying for controlled hunts, all resident youths age 16-17 must possess a valid Oklahoma hunting license for the current calendar year of the drawing. Only residents under 16 years of age are exempt from the purchase of a hunting license (see #3 below). If applicant has a lifetime license, see #4 below.
3. Age Exempt – Only residents under 16 years of age or those born before Jan. 1, 1923, are exempt from the purchase of a hunting license.

4. Resident Oklahoma Lifetime License – Any type of resident lifetime license holder; also includes former residents who hold a resident Oklahoma Lifetime License (they retain all privileges of that license even though they are currently living out of state). Includes the following specific licenses:
 - Resident Oklahoma Lifetime Hunting License
 - Resident Oklahoma Lifetime Combination License
 - Resident Lifetime Hunting (Age 60 and Over) License
 - Resident Lifetime Combination (Age 60 and Over) License
 - Resident Oklahoma Disabled Veteran Lifetime Combination License
5. Resident Oklahoma Senior Citizen Lifetime License – Residents of Oklahoma who will be 64 or older during the current calendar year are eligible to purchase this license. Includes the following license types:
 - Senior Citizen Lifetime Hunting License
 - Senior Citizen Lifetime Combination License

Resident Disability/Disabled Veteran/Nonambulatory License Holders

6. 100% Resident Disabled Veteran – Must have a hunting license that is issued by the Veterans Administration.
7. 60% to 99% Resident Disabled Veteran – Must have a hunting license that is issued by the Veterans Administration.
8. ODWC Disability Hunting License – Residents receiving SSI, Social Security Disability or disability benefit recipients under the Railroad Retirement Act or the Multiple Injury Trust Fund qualify for this license.
9. Resident Nonambulatory – Must have a Nonambulatory Permit from the Department of Wildlife Conservation.
10. Military – Citizens of Oklahoma on authorized leave from the U.S. Armed Forces and serving outside Oklahoma are exempt from the hunting license. Leave papers will be required to hunt. Persons stationed in Oklahoma are required to purchase a hunting license prior to applying for controlled hunts and would select #1.



Nonresidents: You must possess one of the following licenses, or be exempt from one of these licenses, to apply for controlled hunts. You must purchase the license prior to applying for controlled hunts. (Purchase a license by going to <https://www.wildlifedepartment.com/forget1/OnlineSales.aspx>.) Read the following descriptions to determine which best applies to you.

*Note: Nonresidents do not need to purchase a nonresident deer license in order to apply for a deer hunt.

11. Nonresident Annual or 5-Day (consecutive days of the year) Hunting License – Prior to applying for controlled hunts, all nonresidents must possess any valid Oklahoma hunting license during the current calendar year of the drawing. Any such license is nonrefundable if the applicant does not draw a hunt. **Also applies to nonresident youth.**
12. Nonresidents possessing a (resident) Lifetime License - Former residents who hold a resident Oklahoma Lifetime License retain all privileges of that license even though they are currently living out of state. See #4 above.
13. Nonresident Oklahoma Lifetime License – These licenses are no longer sold, but those who possess one already may use it to apply for controlled hunts. Not valid to hunt turkey or big game. Includes the following license types:
 - Nonresident Oklahoma Lifetime Hunting License
 - Nonresident Oklahoma Lifetime Combination License

• WHAT DOES IT COST?

\$ All applicants (including lifetime license holders) must pay a \$5 application fee to enter controlled hunts. This fee is paid only once per person per year regardless of the number of categories entered. You may pay the application fee with a Visa or MasterCard debit or credit card.

If drawn, additional license and user fees may apply. See chart below for costs for successful applicants who are drawn for a hunt.

Some controlled hunts occur on federal lands which require a user fee. Everyone who hunts on these lands must pay the user fee. See chart below for cost.

Reminder: These fees are collected **ONLY** from applicants who are drawn for the hunts.

• WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW BEFORE APPLYING?

? *Be aware of the following requirements which may affect your application.*

1. Prior to applying for the controlled hunts, all applicants (residents and nonresidents) must possess a valid Oklahoma hunting license for the current calendar year of the drawing (unless exempt).

2. Each person may submit only **one** application in each category. This means you may apply only once in Category 1 – Elk, once in Category 2 – Antelope, once in Category 3 – Deer, etc. Within the category you apply for, multiple hunt selections may be allowed. Consult the list below for the maximum number of hunt choices allowed.

Category 1 (Elk hunts): Up to three hunt choices may be selected.

Category 2 (Antelope hunts): Up to three hunt choices may be selected.

Category 3 (Deer hunts): Apply for up to five choices for all deer hunts combined.

Category 4 (Deer hunts for motor vehicle or non-ambulatory permittees): Up to three hunt choices may be selected.

Category 5 (Youth deer hunts): Up to three hunt choices may be selected.

Category 6 (Pursuit with hounds): Hunters may apply for both hunts

Category 7 (Spring turkey hunts): Up to three hunt choices may be selected.

Category 8 (Youth spring turkey hunts): Up to three hunt choices may be selected.

Category 9 (Quail hunts): Up to three hunt choices may be selected.

3. Group applications are allowed **only** in Categories 3, 4, 6, 7 and 9. Remember, since elk and antelope hunts are once in a lifetime, successful applicants for elk and antelope hunts will not be eligible to reapply for those categories.

Category 1 (Elk hunts): One applicant only, **No group applications.**

Category 2 (Antelope hunts): One applicant only, **No group applications.**

Category 3 (Deer hunts): Up to four hunters may apply together.

Category 4 (Deer hunts for motor vehicle or non-ambulatory permittees): Up to four hunters may apply together.

Category 5 (Youth deer hunts): One applicant only, **No group applications.**

Category 6 (Pursuit with hounds): Up to four hunters may apply together.

Category 7 (Spring turkey hunts): Up to two hunters may apply together, except McAlester AAP hunters must apply in pairs.

Category 8 (Youth spring turkey hunts): One applicant only, **No group applications.**

Category 9 (Quail hunts): Up to four hunters may apply together.

Note: Big game hunts are progressively drawn. Elk hunts are drawn first, followed by antelope, then deer. If a hunter is selected for an elk hunt, he or she will receive preference points in the other big game categories (antelope and deer) they have applied for, but will not be eligible to be selected in those categories. Similarly, if they are not selected for elk but draw an antelope permit, then they will receive a preference point in the elk and deer categories but will not be eligible to draw a deer hunt. All other hunts, categories 4-9, are independent and you can be drawn for any or all of those hunts, in addition to one of the big game hunts.

4. Each hunt choice may be selected only one time. For example, if you are applying for Category 5, you can select deer hunt #501 only one time. The other hunt choices must be different numbers.

5. When applying as a group, all hunters must be entered together on the same application prior to submitting the application. Be sure to review and print your confirmation page to ensure all individuals in your group are entered on the same application.

6. **Permits are not transferable to anyone, including family members.** Identification will be required to enter the hunt area.

7. Minimum age requirement for participation in controlled hunts is 14 years by the hunt date (except Category 5 and 8 youth hunts). Applicants for Categories 5 and 8 must be 15 years of age or younger on the first day of the hunt. Hunts at the McAlester Army Ammunition Plant, Salt Plains National Wildlife Refuge, and USDA Research Lab have a minimum age requirement of 12 years of age. Hunts on the Wichita Mountains National Wildlife Refuge have a minimum age requirement of 18 years. Persons under the minimum age may apply provided they turn the required age by the first day of the hunt.

8. Accommodations will be made for all hunters with disabilities, as necessary, for applicable controlled hunts. If drawn, contact the area manager if special accommodations are needed.

9. Applicants who allow hunting partners to apply for them are responsible for verifying that the information on the application is complete and correct. The Department will not make exceptions for the applicant who is disqualified because his or her hunting partner omitted information necessary for the applicant to be eligible.

10. No-shows will not be filled in any category under any circumstances.

11. No refunds will be given.

12. Hunter education certification is required of all hunters 35 years of age and younger (those exempt from hunter education certification are honorably discharged from US Armed Forces, currently on active duty in armed forces, or a member of National Guard.) However, those hunters ages 10 to 35 who are not yet hunter education certified may purchase an apprentice-designated hunting license and apply for controlled hunts (see list below), provided that they are accompanied by a licensed hunter 21 years old or older who possesses a certificate of hunter education or is exempt from either hunter education requirements or license requirements.

A. Applicants for categories 1 and 2 (elk and antelope hunts) may apply with an apprentice license. However, they must be hunter education certified prior to participating in those controlled hunts, unless they are exempt from either hunter education requirements or license requirements.

B. Applicants for categories 3 (deer hunts), 4 (deer hunts for motor vehicle or non-ambulatory permittees), 5 (youth deer hunts), 6 (pursuit with hounds), 7 (spring turkey hunts), 8 (youth turkey hunts), and 9 (quail hunts) may apply using an apprentice-designated license. However,

- category 3, 4, 6, 7, and 9 applicants must apply in a group with an accompanying, licensed hunter 21 years old or older who possesses a certificate of hunter education or is exempt from either hunter education requirements or license requirements.

- category 5 and 8 applicants must be accompanied by an adult non-hunting partner 21 years old or older who possesses a certificate of hunter education or is exempt from either hunter education requirements or license requirements.

13. If applying for Category 4, Deer Hunts for Motor Vehicle or Non-ambulatory Permittees, the appropriate permit code and permit number must be selected.

14. Since elk and antelope hunts are once-in-a-lifetime hunts, successful applicants are never again eligible to apply for those categories.

15. Permits purchased for controlled hunts are for those designated hunts only. Open season licenses (such as deer, turkey, etc.) cannot be used for controlled hunts, and controlled hunt permits cannot be used for open seasons.

• HOW DO I APPLY?

1. Please, make sure you have the following information for ALL applicants so you can complete your application accurately.

- A. Social Security number and Driver's license number (DL not required for youths)
- B. Date of birth
- C. Hunting license number (if exempt, type "exempt" in hunting license number box)
- D. Name and address

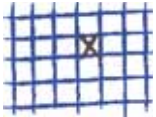
2. To submit applications in *multiple* categories, complete the application process for one category. After printing your confirmation page for the first category, select the link to submit another application. You will be taken back to the first screen to select which category you want to apply in. As long as you submit all applications during the same session, you will not be prompted to re-enter your name, address, hunting license number, etc; this information will be retained until you close the browser window.

3. After submitting your application, print your confirmation page so you have a record of the hunts you applied for. If you applied as a group, the confirmation will list all group members entered on that application. If you discover any discrepancies, contact ODWC immediately for assistance at (405) 524-6169 or email your name, date of birth, and an explanation of the problem to controlledhunts@odwc.state.ok.us.

• WHEN IS THE DEADLINE TO APPLY?

The application deadline is **Saturday, May 15, 2010, at 11:59 p.m., CST.**

• WHEN IS THE DRAWING?



The drawing is held in July. **Results will be available on our Web site beginning July 7, 2010, at 8:00 a.m.** Successful applicants will receive notification in the mail and, after paying all fees, will be able to download maps and hunt information from wildlifedepartment.com.

Unsuccessful applicants will not be notified, but will be awarded a preference point which will increase their odds of drawing a hunt the next time they apply.

• WHAT HAPPENS AFTER THE DRAWING?

Applicants may check to see if they were selected for a controlled hunt online beginning July 7, 2010 at wildlifedepartment.com. Printed lists will not be available.



If I'm drawn?

Successful applicants will receive notification by mail. Those drawn may have fees due for additional licenses and/or user fees. These may be paid online anytime after July 7 through the payment deadline. Fees may be paid with a Visa or Mastercard debit or credit card.


Hunt information will be immediately available online once fees are paid. Successful applicants will need to access and print off their specific hunt instructions and maps from the controlled hunts Web

site once all appropriate fees are paid. These items will not be mailed. **To view or print off maps and hunt instructions, visit the controlled hunts Web site at www.wildlifedepartment.com/controlhunt.htm.** The actual permit allowing access to the hunt area will be mailed to successful applicants once fees are paid.

See “What does it cost?” section for payment fees. **These fees are collected only from applicants drawn for hunts.** There are no refunds for controlled hunt fees, and money will not be accepted at the hunt site.

Each of the categories has a payment deadline for all fees. See chart below for the due dates.

Unsuccessful applicants will not be notified, but will be awarded a preference point which will increase their odds of drawing a hunt the next time they apply.

Preference Point System Overview

Oklahoma’s controlled hunts have always been very popular, with lots of hunters applying for a relatively small number of permits. With such a limited number of permits, a true preference system (one in which people with the most preference points get drawn first) is not possible. Instead, our system is one that makes it more likely that people with the most points will get drawn, but there is still a chance that hunters with no points can get drawn before someone who has accumulated several points.

The Department uses a computerized drawing system that randomly selects from the pool of applicants in each of the hunt categories offered. If you are not selected for a hunt in a certain category, you receive a preference point for that category.

Each preference point you have earned by not drawing a hunt in a certain category acts like an extra application the next time that you apply for that same category. For example, if you have not drawn out for five straight times in the deer category, you will be five times more likely to be selected in the deer category than a first-time applicant.

In some categories, hunters may apply in groups of up to four people. Each applicant in the hunt group will be given a single preference point if not drawn in that category. For group applications, the preference points of each hunter in the group will be averaged. If four hunters put in together – one with no points, one with two points, and the other two with three points each – the group’s preference points will be two, which is the average of all four members.

Once you are selected for a hunt category, you lose all of your preference points in that category, regardless of whether or not you actually participate in the hunt. This means if you draw a regular deer hunt, you lose your points in the deer category, but not in the elk or antelope categories.

More Details About the Preference Point System

1. Preference points are tracked by your Social Security number and your driver's license number. If your driver's license number has changed since the last time you applied for a controlled hunt, please contact the ODWC at (405) 524-6169.
2. Hunters do not have to apply every year to keep their preference points. However, if you do not apply for five years in a row, the computer will clear your file and all preference points will be forfeited.
3. Preference points are not transferable from one hunter to another, or from one category to another.
4. Big game hunts are progressively drawn. Elk hunts are drawn first, followed by antelope, then deer. If a hunter is selected for an elk hunt, they will receive preference points in the other big game categories (antelope and deer) they have applied for but will not be eligible to be selected in those categories. Similarly, if they are not selected for elk but draw an antelope permit, then they will receive a preference point in the elk and deer categories, but will not be eligible to draw a deer hunt. This is designed to ensure that no hunter is selected for multiple big game hunts in the same year.
5. If you apply with a group for a Category 3 deer hunt and individually for a Category 1 elk hunt, it is possible for you to be drawn individually for the elk hunt and for your group to be drawn for the deer hunt. In this case, since the three big game categories, elk, antelope and deer, are progressively drawn, you would be allowed to participate in the elk hunt, but not with the rest of your group in the deer hunt. You would then receive a preference point for Category 3 and the rest of your group's individual preference points for Category 3 would be cleared to zero.
6. Successful applicants will lose their preference points regardless of whether they actually participate in the hunt.
7. There is no maximum number of preference points an applicant can accumulate.

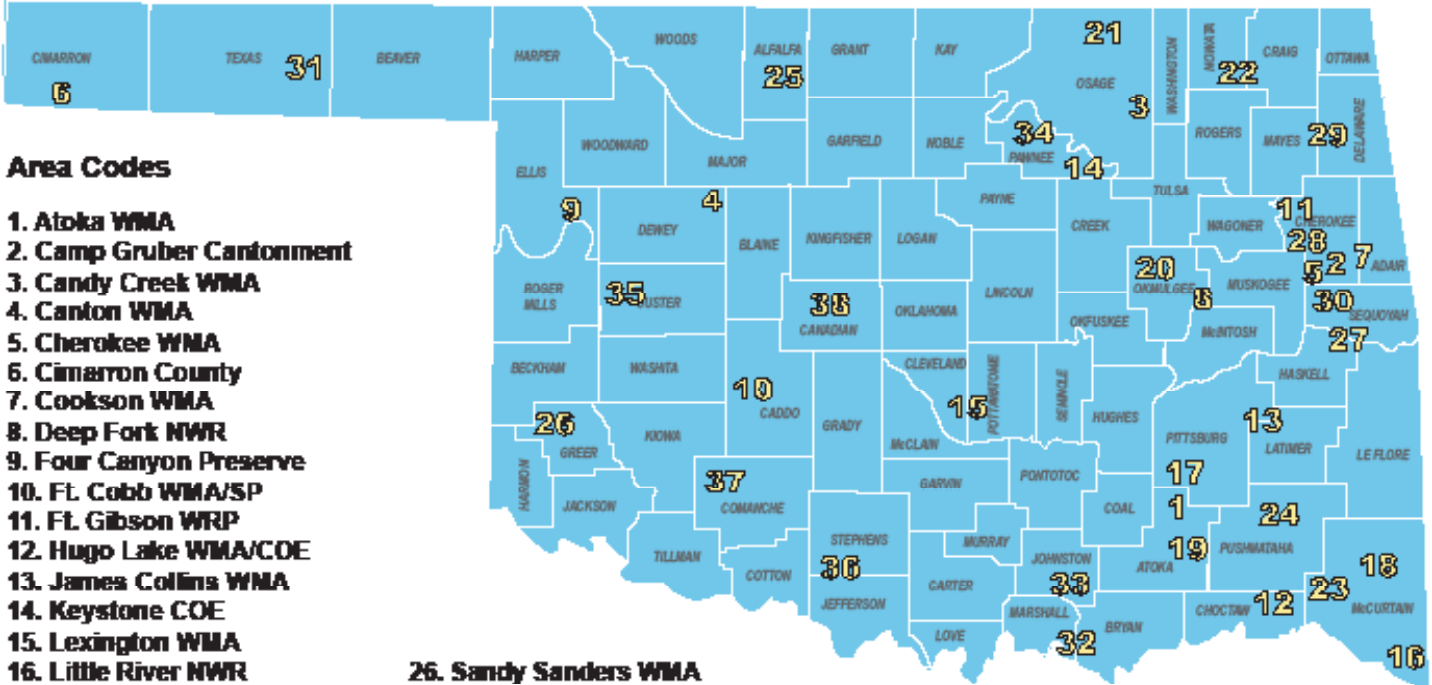

(Can only be drawn once in a lifetime if drawn in 2002 or later.) Minimum age requirements for Controlled Hunts is 14, unless otherwise specified. One applicant only; **No group applications.** Up to three hunt choices may be selected.

A) Selected Wichita Mountains NWR elk applicants must attend a pre-hunt briefing at 10:00 a.m. on the day preceding their hunt at the Visitor Center. Minimum age requirement is 18 years of age. **Special Note:** Applicants should be prepared for extremely rough terrain and expect rigorous exercise during hunts. Applicants are strongly encouraged to bring a helper to assist with removal of carcass from hunt area to hunter check station. Firearm requirements are centerfire only rifles of .270 caliber or larger. All handguns are prohibited. There is a five (5) shells per day limit.

B) To be arranged. The successful applicant will receive contact information and the dates and times will be arranged.

Category 2 - Antelope Hunts

Can only be drawn once in a lifetime if drawn in 2002 or later. Minimum age requirements for Controlled Hunts is 14. One applicant only; **No group applications**. Up to three (3) hunt choices may be selected. These hunts occur on private property. The Wildlife Dept. does not maintain a record of available private lands. It is the responsibility of all successful applicants to contact landowners and obtain written permission prior to hunting on private lands and the hunter must have this written permission in possession while hunting. Private land access fees may be charged by the landowner.

C) Physically Challenged (phy. chal.) Archery Hunt - Applicants must have a permanent disability to the extent that they cannot use a conventional longbow, as certified by a physician licensed to practice in Oklahoma or bordering state or a non-ambulatory or motor vehicle permit. A person who qualifies to use a crossbow shall have in their possession while in the field, and present at hunt check-in, written evidence of such certification. In addition, at McAlester AAP, selected applicants must report on the Thursday preceding their hunt to attend a pre-hunt briefing. Failure to attend this briefing will result in cancellation. Hunters under 18 years of age must be accompanied by an adult. Hunter may bring an assistant. Assistants will be allowed to transport hunters to and from the field and/or stands, but **will not** be allowed to hunt. Assistance will be provided for others as needed. Background checks will be conducted on all successful applicants and convicted felons will not be allowed. Hunts may be cancelled at any time. A \$25 Federal User Fee is required to participate in the hunt.

D) Hunters are required to attend a mandatory pre-hunt briefing at noon on the first day of the hunt at the Tishomingo NWR Refuge Headquarters. All handguns are prohibited at the Tishomingo NWR.

E) Bag limit will be one (1) deer of either-sex and one (1) turkey of either-sex.

F) Minimum age requirement is 18 years of age.

G) Hunters are required to attend a mandatory meeting at Refuge Headquarters on Friday. On Salt Plains NWR, hunters with disabilities requiring special accommodations should only apply for Deer Hunts for Persons with Non-ambulatory or Motor Vehicle Permit (Category 4).

H) Selected applicants for deer archery hunts are required to report on the Thursday preceding their hunt to attend a pre-hunt briefing and check-in. Failure to attend briefing will result in cancellation. Hunts end at noon on Sunday. Only traditional type bows (long bows or recurve bows) allowed. Minimum bow weight of 40 lbs., at 28 inches of draw. Bare bows, no attachments. **compound bows and crossbows are prohibited.** Hunters under 18 years of age must be accompanied by an adult. Background checks will be conducted on all successful applicants and convicted felons will not be allowed. Hunts may be cancelled at any time. A \$25 Federal User Fee is required to participate in the hunt.

I) Other hunting seasons will be open on the WMA during this hunt period.

K) Two (2) deer limit. First deer -- Antlerless or spike only. Second deer -- Either-Sex.

M) One Either-Sex permit may be substituted for an Antlerless Only permit for a limited number of applicants by random drawing at the hunt site on the day of the hunt.

N) Selected applicants must attend a pre-hunt briefing at 10:00 a.m. on the day preceding their hunt at the Visitor Center. **Special Note:** Applicants should be prepared for extremely rough terrain and expect rigorous exercise during hunts. Firearm requirements are the same as statewide deer gun season, **centerfire only.** All handguns are prohibited. There is a five (5) shells per day limit.

R) Hunters under 18 years of age must be accompanied by an adult.

W) This is an extremely physically demanding hunt in rough terrain with dense brush. Camping is allowed in the hunt area for those who wish to do so.

U) Hunt begins at noon on Friday and ends at noon on Sunday. No shows will not be filled, permittees only.

Y) Hunters must attend a mandatory pre-hunt briefing at 5:30 AM on the first day of the hunt. The briefing will be held in Building 128 at Camp Gruber.

Z) Hunters are required to attend a mandatory pre-hunt briefing on the first day of the hunt at 5:30 a.m. at Refuge headquarters. Hunt begins after briefing and ends 1/2 hour after sunset of second day.

Category 4 - Deer Hunts for Persons with Non-Ambulatory or Motor Vehicle Permit

Only persons who hold either a non-ambulatory permit or motor vehicle permit may apply for Category 4 either individually or with up to three additional hunters who possess one of these permits (except Salt Plains NWR one applicant only). Up to three hunt choices may be selected. Applicants are limited to persons possessing at least one of the following free permits prior to applying:

- *Non-ambulatory Permit* - Persons who are unable to walk due to a single or double leg amputation, paralysis of lower extremity(ies) and/or disease or injury and are confined to a wheelchair as their primary source of mobility as certified by a medical doctor licensed to practice in Oklahoma or a bordering state may receive this permit.
- *Motor Vehicle Permit* - Persons having a permanent disability which confines them to a wheelchair, or requires the use of crutches, a walker or other means of support or assistance for body mobility as certified by a medical doctor licensed to practice in Oklahoma or a bordering state. Applicants must list hunting license type, hunting license number and either a non-ambulatory or motor vehicle permit number when applying for Category 4. Persons with these permits may also put in with non-permittees for Category 3 hunts, in which case accommodations can be made through the area manager for successful applicants possessing one of these permits (except for Salt Plains NWR).

G) Hunters are required to attend a mandatory meeting at Refuge Headquarters on Friday.

J) One applicant only. It is highly recommended hunters bring a non-hunting helper to assist in set up, deer cleaning, retrieval, and checking in.

K) Two (2) deer limit. First deer -- Antlerless or spike only. Second deer -- Either-Sex.

L) Sequoyah Resort Park hunters will be charged a \$30.00 State Park user fee collected at check-in in addition to applicable permit and license fees.
