(the Tom Steed Development Center is located on the northwest corner of the intersection of I-40 and Hudiburg Rd.)

Individuals may take the exam once in a 12-month period. Exam scores are valid for 12 months from the exam date. Participating in this exam does not guarantee employment or that there are any current openings. Interviews will be scheduled **only** when there is an employment opening.

Two exams are given, one for Biologist, Game Warden and Assistant Hatchery Manager, and one for the Technician positions. An hour is given to take each exam. If you meet the education requirements, you may take both exams on this date. The exams will cover state and federal wildlife laws and regulations, Oklahoma geography, biological and environmental sciences relating to fish and wildlife, environmental education, communications, ecology, and Department programs.

Eligibility: Applicants taking the exam for **Biologists** and **Asst. Hatchery Manager** must have a Bachelor's degree in a wildlife related field, or be within 6 months of graduation. **Game Warden** applicants must have a Bachelor's degree with at least 16 credit hours in a wildlife related field, preference is for a wildlife degree, or be within 6 months of graduation. **Technician** applicants must have 2 yrs. of college in a wildlife related field, or 6 yrs. of related experience.
