Amendment #1

Cultural Resources Special Conditions – Vegetation Clearing, Tree Cutting, and Fencing (Fencing-not in this Bid)

Acceptable Actions: Fence and gate maintenance, repair, or construction must be conducted by hand (to avoid further compliance requirements). Vegetation clearing or old fencing removal may be accomplished by lifting vertically and piling with small equipment such as a skid steer or bobcat (see below).

In order to avoid ground disturbance, fencing, trees, or debris should not be removed by pushing or pulling at an angle. Any tree clearing must be done by hand, with stumps left in place (may be cut as low to the ground as possible or ground down). Trees should not be pushed over, as this causes significant ground disturbance. Should trees need be removed with heavy equipment or dragged/pushed across the ground, additional review will be required.

Acceptable Equipment: Drum mulcher on a skid steer or tractor (used top down only-no driving with it down), hand clearing with chainsaw, skid steer or tractor with tree shear attachment or tree cutter head that cuts at ground surface, skid steer or tractor with grapple attachment, brush cutter, brush hog, or buncher/feller.

Machines should only be operated on dry ground with rubber tires and driven in wide turns to avoid soil churning.

Setting of fence posts (following fencing specifications provided-not in this Bid) should be done by hand (or with gas-powered augers, handheld, or skid steer-mounted).

The following actions are **prohibited UNLESS** additional compliance requirements are met:

Grubbing, grading, pushing out/over, ripping, dragging, dozing, driving with drum head down, or any other ground disturbance activity not stated in the acceptable actions or acceptable equipment. Ground disturbance is defined as any disturbance of the ground regardless of depth.

If ground disturbing methods are required, contact the project office for guidance.
