An Act relating to public buildings and public works; exempting certain fish and wildlife conservation contracts from bidding requirements of the Public Competitive Bidding Act of 1974; authorizing certain other bidding process for contracts of or less than a certain amount; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SUBJECT: Oklahoma Competitive Bidding Act of 1974

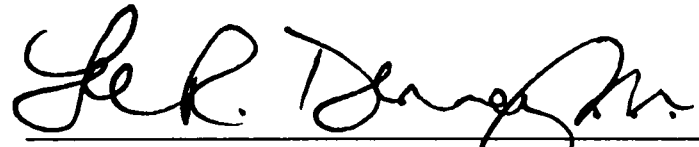
BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 103.7 of Title 61, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:


For purposes of the provisions of the Public Competitive Bidding Act of 1974, contracts entered into solely for projects and activities by the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation relating to fish and wildlife conservation shall be let and awarded using the competitive bidding process as set forth in the Public Competitive Bidding Act of 1974. However, for contracts of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) or less the Department may administer the competitive bidding process and let and award the contract itself rather than the Construction and Properties Division of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2014.
