

**OKLAHOMA DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE  
CONSERVATION HUNTER EDUCATION SAFETY  
PROTOCOL (COVID-19)**

- Temperature will be taken prior to entering class. Anyone with a temperature over 100.2 may not enter. Law Enforcement will work with Accounting to get a reasonable number of thermometers purchased and distributed to Lts/districts.
- Students should stay six feet away from people who they did not arrive with while queuing up for check-in and seating. Six foot markers will be placed where people are waiting in line.
- Students will be asked to clearly identify the materials with their name to prevent from inadvertently using someone else's materials.
- Cut max class size in half. i.e. if listed class size was 40, it will now be 20. Consult with lead instructor of the class to see if this is practical and provides safety.
- Masks will be worn anytime social distancing is not practical. Each classroom or class setting will involve its own circumstances and needs to be evaluated by the instructor(s). The classroom should be set up so that the instructor is more than 6 feet away from while presenting so that the instructor will not need to wear a mask.
- Students to maintain a distance of at least six feet from instructors and other participants they didn't come with.
- Students bring their own pencils or get disposable pencils.
- Students grade their own tests.
- Before leaving the classroom, students police their area and either trash or take anything there.
- If shotgun activity is planned it can go on, but need to also follow the STEP protocol.
- Any community touch-points not covered should be eliminated. i.e. raffles, hands-on demonstrations, etc.
- Food will not be provided.
- We may ask participants to bring their own lunches, and if so, they will be asked to social distance while eating them.
- If participants are asked to have lunch offsite, they will be given additional time and encouraged to go through a drive-thru or do curbside pickup.
