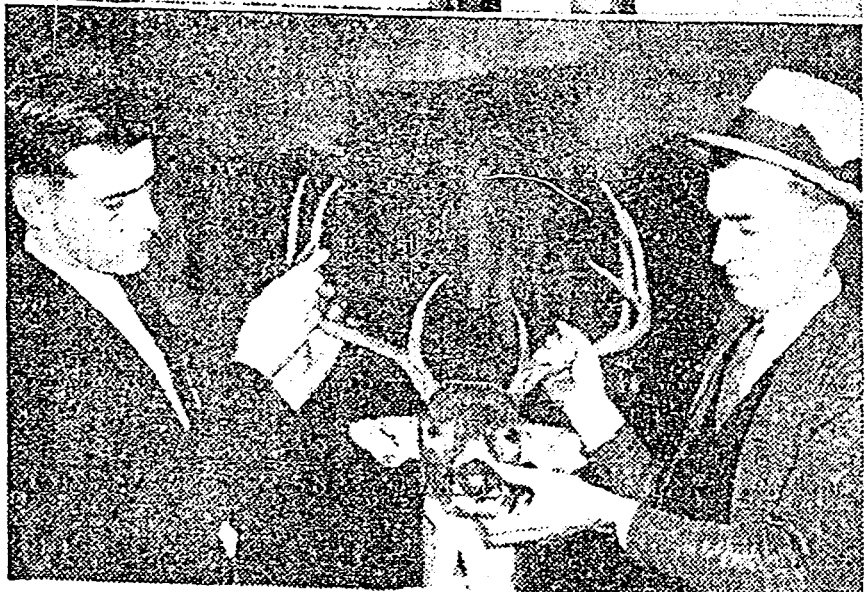


## City Hunters Get Their Deer

Here are three of Oklahoma's big game hunters and their trophies of the chase. The three men pictured saw their first deer hunt this year and all three killed their first deer.

Mont Curnutt, president of the Tower Drug Co., and his wife were out without a guide early in the week. They saw 11-point and seven-point bucks at a distance of 300 yards. Curnutt cut loose with his regulation army rifle and brought the deer down without a struggle. Mrs. Curnutt, using a less powerful rifle, wounded her deer but not fatally.

John Boyd and his father, W. E., also were hunting without a guide. John brought down a ten-point buck and they were carrying it home on a pole. Two bucks and a doe were sighted and the elder Boyd, pole still on his shoulder, swung up his rifle and picked off an eight-point buck.
